



Children's Community School

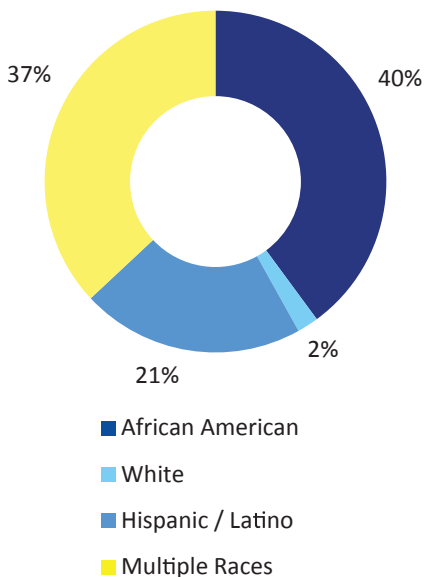
CCS is a Connecticut Priority School District. Students qualify for free breakfast and lunch based on the average income level of families, most of whom live at or below the Federal Poverty Level.



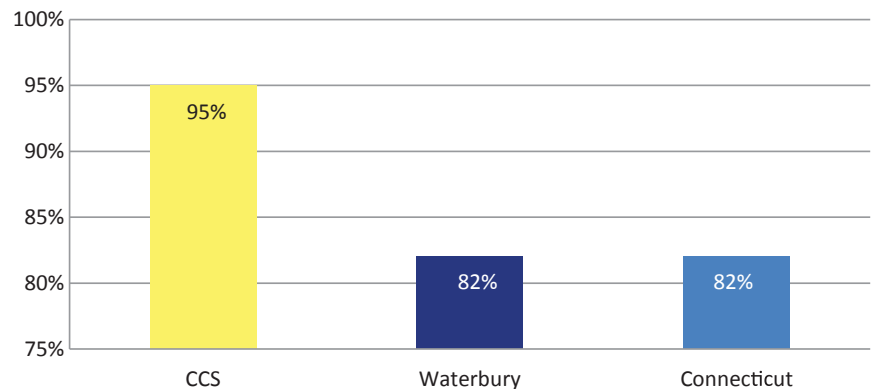
CCS boasts a 94-100% on time high school graduation rate.



Race & Ethnicity



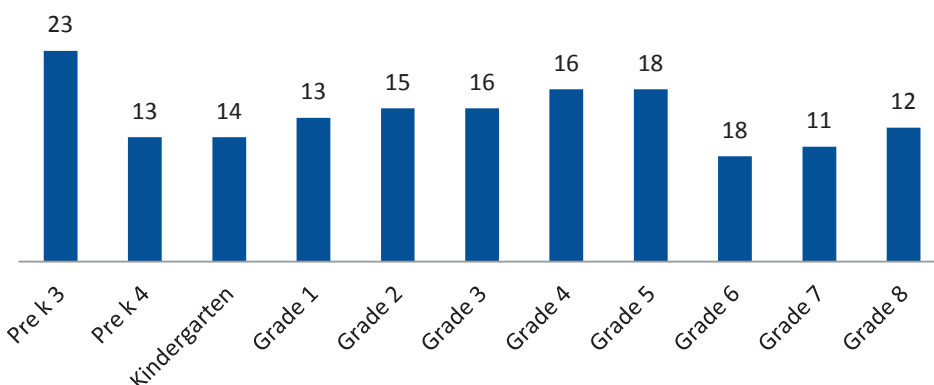
2024 -2025 Attendance Comparison

Support Programming and Extracurricular Activities

Without the support of our generous donors, these extracurricular activities and supporting programs, would not be available to Children's Community School students.

Before School Care- Many parents drop their students off as early as 7am. K-8 students can take part in physical education opportunities, homework help, or play games with their peers. Our PreKindergarten Program is full year 7am - 5pm. **Active Kids, Active Minds.**

Mentoring- Middle school students are paired with volunteers who meet weekly. This group utilizes activities such as culinary activities, field trips, art and crafts, which solicit and build communication, leadership and empowerment.

Social Work and Counseling- This extremely important piece of CCS is funded solely on grants and donations. CCS is fortunate to offer students two part time onsite social workers throughout the school year.

Bravo! Waterbury- This program is in partnership with the Waterbury Symphony Orchestra and takes place after school. Students are able to engage in various string instruments, chorus and dance.

ASAP!- (Formerly known as 'After School Arts Program') Has partnered with CCS providing school programs that make learning joyful through the arts. Teaching artists visit CCS throughout the school year and lead programs in music, visual arts, performing arts, science, writing, design, and play.

Art Club- This is the first year that CCS has utilized donor funding to hire a part time art teacher who works with K-8 students during the week developing amazing artwork which is displayed throughout CCS and at CCS fundraising events. The art teacher also offers an after school art club 3 nights a week for students that wish to expand on their artistic abilities.

Mattatuck Museum- The Matt provides both onsite and offsite educational activities to CCS students. Artists come to CCS to work with students on expressing themselves through various forms of art. CCS students also visit the museum on field trips where they are able to expand their arts experience.

Physical Education Club- CCS is now able to offer a PE Club which is held twice a week. Students are able to attend this club, which is organized by the CCS PE teacher, and take part in organized physical education activities with their peers.
